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Vision Statement Finding the light in ourselves and each other

At St John's we want all of our children to have 'the light of life.' Furthermore, we want our children to know their special gifts and to be happy within themselves, as well as knowing the gifts of their classmates too. We can all get frustrated or upset with one another for different reasons, but compassion, empathy and understanding is really important and these attributes quite often get forgotten in society. Therefore, we need to find the light in everyone (including ourselves), whilst remembering that although we are all unique, we are all made in God's image.

School Values

Our school community is a place where each child feels safe, respected and valued. This is a school in which each member supports one another on the journey of discovery and learning. We empower children to fulfil their potential through providing a stimulating, supportive and inclusive environment. We encourage all of our children whatever their ability, to be the best that they can be by setting high standards in everything that we do. We help to foster the development of an enquiring attitude towards learning and encourage children to be reflective, resilient and responsible. This is achieved through the teaching of our school values, which are: Love, Hope, Joy, Forgiveness, Faith and Goodness. These school values are further supported and complimented by the innate use of our universal (British) values of: Democracy, Tolerance, Rule of Law, Individual Liberty and Mutual Respect.

Golden Rules

Our message to everyone in our school is consistent and clear: Do Be Safe, Do Be Responsible and Do Aim High. These school rules underpin all of our beliefs and expectations in school.

Learning Statement Soar on wings like Eagles

Our learning statement is inspired by Isaiah, chapter 40, verse 31. This verse reads, "But those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary; they will walk and not faint." We want children to make mistakes and to not let failure dampen their dreams. All children are to aim high, learn from their mistakes and keep a positive mindset.

SCHOOL RESPONSIBILITIES

The school will:

- Deliver a school environment and curriculum that reflects the Christian Character and British Values of the school's identity;
- Provide a safe, secure, caring and stimulating learning environment;
- Teach and encourage your child to do their best and achieve their full potential as a valued member of the school community;
- Develop in each child, positive values and a caring attitude towards the school community and the environment;
- Provide a balanced curriculum of the highest quality and meet the individual needs of every child by following national guidelines rigorously;
- Set weekly home-learning to develop and consolidate core skills in English and Mathematics;
- Share with you our curriculum expectations throughout the year;
- Be welcoming and offer opportunities for parents/carers to become involved in the daily life of the school;
- Contact parents/carers as soon as concerns are raised about your child's learning, behaviour, attendance or punctuality;
- Have a clear and consistent approach to rewards and consequences for children as set out in the Behaviour Policy;
- Communicate between home and school through letters, newsletters, website and general meetings;
- Celebrate your child's academic and personal achievements;
- Provide the scaffolding needed to enable your child to achieve their full potential;
- Care for your child's safety and well-being by observation and listening.
- Teach your child to develop a positive attitude to one another, regardless of gender, race, culture, belief, values, age and need;
- Encourage your child to become an active member within our community and help them to see that they can have an impact on the world around them;
- Regularly meet with you to communicate the progress of your child, celebrating their strengths and explaining how we can support them in their areas for development;
- Provide information to you about our school, including relevant policies, meetings, workshops, activities, newsletters and open days;
- Provide information and helpful training sessions for you that will give you confidence to support your child.

PARENTAL RESPONSIBILITIES

To help my child at school, I will:

- Respect and support the Christian Character and British Values of the school;
- See that my child attends school regularly, is punctual and properly equipped and ready to learn;
- Follow the school values and school rules at all times when communicating with other parents and members of staff;
