Improvements to the school:

Rocksteady is up and running. This will be on Wednesday's in the morning for those who have managed to sign up. We are looking at expanding this for next half term.

The school are moving the PE equipment into the school hall area, new equipment will be ordered shortly.

We have also begun to put a big order of sports equipment into the school too.

The website is being updated weekly to reflect changes to policies and calendars. We will update you here for any changes that you may want to check.

Additionally, we are looking at getting more iPads for the school and an easier system to run the devices more smoothly. Year 6 have had training and letters will follow. Year 5 will be the next class to start using Seesaw.

Academic highlights

Here is some useful information that is happening in the school.

PE:

Swimming: Thank you Years 4-6 for completing the survey. From the results, we will be sending all of Year 4 for two weeks intensive swim in the Autumn term – a letter will come out shortly.

During the Summer period, another two week intensive course or weekly sessions (depending on availability) will then be opened up for those not meeting the national standard.

Earrings on PE days: Please come to school on your PE days without earrings, this helps to reduce earrings being lost. If you have only recently had your ears pierced, please speak to the class teacher.

PSHE - Keeping Safe Focus

The focus for this half term for children in Reception to year 6 is 'Being me in this world'

Last Friday the focus for the half term was shared through a 'launch assembly ' which Mrs de la Croix led.

The children were encouraged to think of how we can work together by using kind hands and kind words each day.

Each week the children will continue to explore this theme through their weekly PSHE lessons

TTrockstars and Numbots:

Part of our homework is to practice our times tables on TTrockstars or Numbots. TTrockstars is for Years 3-6 (in the summer, Year 2 will also be taking part in this). Numbots is for Reception to Year

2. These workshops will be run by Mr Worton-Geer who has a wealth of knowledge on how to practice times tables, number fluency and is currently the Maths lead. A letter from an author:

To everyone at St John's CofE Primary School,

I hope you're excited about the new school year and are looking forward to discovering lots of wonderful new stories in your class or school library!

When I was your age, I was an avid reader. My friends often complained that I wasn't listening to their chat and they were right, sometimes I wasn't! But it is a brilliant feeling, isn't it, when you're enjoying a story so much you don't want to put it down? What's your favourite book? If you haven't found one yet, keep looking. Somewhere, in a bookshop or on a library shelf, is a story you'll love forever.

Books are so special and so important. Occasionally, real-life can get boring, but not when we can lose ourselves in exciting stories. All we have to do is jump aboard that magic carpet, or into that flying car, and we can go on wonderful adventures without ever leaving the building! And sometimes real-life can get sad or difficult. Reading stories can help us realise that we're not alone and that lots of other people have been through the same problems and come out the other side. Also, the whole time we're reading we are developing empathy, that vital ability to stand in other people's shoes. Reading fiction actually makes us kinder people, so be readers.

I write children's fiction because for me, the stories I read as a child are the ones that had the deepest impact. Ann Holm's I am David was the first book to make me cry. The Borrowers made my imagination soar. The Silver Sword and The Eagle of the Ninth got me interested in history. SF Said, the brilliant author of Tyger, said it beautifully: the books we love when we're young stay with us forever, and make us who we are.

I have been a published author since April 2015, when I won the Kelpies Prize for my debut novel, *The Mixed-Up Summer of Lily McLean*, although I actually decided when I was about eight years old that I wanted to be a children's author. It took a very long time for me to feel brave enough to send my work to publishers. If you are interested in becoming an author, don't be like me. Enter competitions and get your writing in front of an audience. Be confident and don't give up. Keep practising and improving and you will get there.

It is, by the way, great fun being an author. I love visiting schools, libraries and festivals and talking to children about reading and writing. I really enjoy signing books in bookshops. The writing is sometimes the difficult bit, the part where I have to sit down at my desk and get on with it, no excuses allowed. Being a published author doesn't happen without hard work, but if you really, really want something, you have to do your absolute best to make it happen!

I've had nine children's novels published now, including *The Titanic Detective Agency* and *Guardians of the Wild Unicorns*, which was nominated for the Carnegie Medal! *Euro Spies* came out in April 2023 and is a spy caper set in six European cities and is packed with clues to solve and codes to crack.

My latest novel, *Ice Cream Boy*, came out in May this year. I began writing *Ice Cream Boy* soon after my mum's death from Alzheimer's disease and that aspect of Luca's story feels very personal. It was not an easy subject to write about, particularly for children, and I didn't want to write a depressing book! So, my main character, 12-year-old Luca, is a fast-talking joker who is often in trouble at school, but is determined to save his family's Glasgow ice cream shop by inventing the best ice cream in the world. If you read any of my novels, please write or email and tell me what you think.
