#### First two weeks back!

It has been a very busy first two weeks coming back. The weather hasn't always been brilliant, but the children have worked incredibly hard both inside and outside of school.



#### Forest school year 6 - 28th of February 2025

Today in forest school we started off by carrying a bunch of logs into a small log storing area. Once we had finished this we gathered in a little green tent and Mr WG taught us a few steps on how to make a small fire. The first step was grading sticks, we did this by ordering different size sticks, lots of us found this a bit tricky as we struggled with the layers but we still did great. Then he taught us different types of fires such as: Swedish house and a teepee hut house. We all grouped up into 3's and got to work. We set off to find a different range of twigs, sticks and small branches. Once we felt we had collected enough we found some more small twigs to use as kindling. We then started to build up our fires and they started to form shape really quickly. Soon afterwords we grouped all of our sticks together and made a huge fire that was a mix of the Swedish house and the teepee hut house. After we were sure that the fire would be safe then we all sat round and had delicious smores. All of us really enjoyed the smores as they were nice and toasted as we like them. 
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
