<p>Science: Create a papier mâché planet. Model your sphere on a planet in the solar system. Think about its size, colour and other characteristics. Alternatively, you could use polystyrene balls to create your own heliocentric model.</p>	<p>English/art: Make your own 'Ancient Greek' mythical creature. You can make a model, paint a picture, produce a collage... To help, you could refer to the examples we looked at in English (on Seesaw).</p>	<p>Geography: Draw a map of a place that is special to you. It might be a place you regularly visit or the roads in your own neighbourhood.</p>
<p>Make an origami model. Can you research about it. For example, the Japanese 'crane' carries a very important message.</p>	<p>Play a sport that you haven't played before or don't usually play. Write a set of rules for the game so that a younger player can join in.</p>	<p>Patterns and strategy: can you complete the sudoku summer challenge? You will find this in the HOMEWORK SUMMER TERM folder on Seesaw. Page 1 breaks you in gently then progress to slightly harder grids on the second page.</p>
<p>Write a short story based on this picture. In Seesaw you will find an opening paragraph, possible sentence starters and a detailed copy of the picture. You could write it by hand or digitally.</p>	 <p>Visit a museum or art gallery and talk with your parents/carers about what you found interesting. You might want to do further research and find out a little bit more about something that saw.</p>	<p>Write a poem about 'summer'. You can draw an illustration to accompany it. As an extra challenge, you might want to use your poem as lyrics and make up your own song.</p>
<p>Design and make your perfect summer sandwich. You might be able to make a few and go on a picnic with your family... or share them at home as a special tea-time experience.</p>	<p>Geography: with guidance from your parents/carers, find a suitable, safe place and make a traffic tally. How many (and what type of) vehicles use that road? What time of day and for how many minutes did the survey span? You might want to repeat it at another time of day and see if the results are different.</p>	<p>Crossword Follow the clues to complete the May-themed crossword.
