SIAMS report

Both pupils and parents are always eager to see their school reports. It's an opportunity to take a snapshot of where a child is, acknowledge their journey and look to the future.

Schools, themselves, have a myriad of reports about them too. Everyone tends to think about OFSTED, but we also have School Effectiveness Advisor visits and last month a Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools (SIAMS) which looks at the school's vision, values and religious responsibilities. These visits are often a key focus for us as governors as well as all the staff.

You can read the latest SIAMS report on our <u>website</u> and whilst it looks with a spirituality focus, it actually is a great representation of how the school thinks and works together as a community delivering for the children. Seeing someone say "St John's is a school where pupils and adults can thrive. They exude happiness and are proud to belong to this school. 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Year 4 report on swimming:

At Hatfield Pool we did life saving and loads of different strokes, here are some of the things we did:-

Life Saving

In life saving we were taught how to save someone if they fell into a lake or deep water. You would save someone in a lake by finding a long stick and then going onto your stomach and holding the stick out as far as you can. Hopefully they can grab hold of it, but if they are too far away you would need to find something that floats and throw it out to them.

Front Crawl

When we did front crawl, we would kick our legs and scoop the water, bringing our heads to the side to breath. Our body's had to be straight.

Backstroke

When we were doing backstroke we had to have a straight back and have really good kicking legs. Backstroke was a bit harder because we had to keep putting our head up and down.

Butterfly

To do butterfly we would bring our arms up and then hit the water, while wiggling our legs like jelly.

Treading Water

To tread water we needed to do breaststroke legs whilst moving our arms up and down. We tried to do it for 3 minutes!

Diving Board

When we were going off the diving board, we weren't allowed to use goggles because it could be dangerous and we could damage our eyes. Our first try was a bit scary, but it was still fun! One time, Rafferty did an old person jump and fell in saying, "Oh great heavens!" On the second time he did a flip and splashed everyone!

Sinkers

The sinkers were fun to play with and we played a team game where you had to get as many sinkers using your mouth and feet, with no goggles, and put them in a bucket to see who got the most. We played many rounds of this!
