Academic Highlights

Here is some useful information that is happening in the school.

Nursery:



The Nursery children looked fantastic in their red, white and blue.

We made special bookmarks to commemorate the day and made our own Union Jack flags too.

We talked about why we celebrate VE Day and why the Union Jack flag is important for us. We also learnt a

special song. In the afternoon we joined the whole school for a special assembly about VE Day.

Year 1:

Year 1 have embraced a hands-on approach to mathematics



this week, engaging in practical outdoor learning to deepen our understanding of multiplication and division. By using natural objects to form equal groups within hoops, children the have been enthusiastically sharing their reasoning and engaging in rich mathematical dialogue.

Reception:



Reception went on a trip to Christ the King in order to learn about the special areas within the Christian Church. Selina told us all about the font, the praver area which has candles and the altar. We are so lucky to have such a lovely church so close to our school.

Year 2:



'Year 2 have enjoyed a wonderful week at St. John's! On Wednesday 7th May we visited Appleby Farm in Cheshunt for our school trip. Pupils had the chance to groom ponies, collect chicken eggs and feed bananas to the cows. The baby goats were particularly popular! The fun continued into Thursday 8th May, as we celebrated VE Day by listening to Churchill's speech

and writing a diary entry, pretending that we were there celebrating in 1945.'

Year 3:

In Year 3 we had a spirituality lesson where we were thinking about connecting with God. We recognised that not everyone



has the same beliefs and that some people might believe in God and some may not or may not know what they believe in. The children wrote a prayer or drew a picture to God. If the children didn't believe in God they wrote what they would like to say to God if

they did believe. All our prayers/pictures were put in our class book.

Year 5: Forest School – 9/5/25

We cleared away so many stinging nettles, brambles and lots



of Himalayan Balsam from our woodland area. By the end of the morning there were 3 decent-sized weed piles. Halfway through the morning, we visited our little allotment patch in the Nursery Garden and cleared the weeds, ready for the planting

and growing that we hope will happen soon. Many children also made artwork inspired by British artist, Andy Goldsworthy

Year 4:

Year 4 had a fantastic morning at Forest School, we went on a bug hunt, and found beetles, worms, slugs,



ladybirds, ants, snails, bees, centipedes and spiders, sadly we didn't spot any frogs or snakes... vet!!

We also undertook a mammoth weeding task, Myra was star weeder and got stuck in, she thoroughly enjoyed using the large spade and digging the weeds out from their roots, determined to get them out and clear the way.

Year 6:

Year 6 have completed their KS2 SATs this week - they have worked so hard and made us so incredibly proud. Our next steps will be our Y6 residential after half term and beginning practice our Y6 production! Here is a photo of some of us having fun after SATs!
