Start of a new year!

Dear all.

It has been a great first week and half back and the weather most of the time has been pleasant. It was great to see everyone coming back from their holidays and I am glad that children have settled in well. We have had a busy Summer preparing for this new academic year – see below for some photos.

I want to assure you that I am always about if you would like to come and share some good news or want to discuss any worries. It is vital to have an open relationship as we help the journey of your children at our school. I strongly feel that we are a family at this school, never forget we are here to help you as well as the children.

Over the last few days, we have been preparing for the year including organising sports events, forest schools and working on the parish event diaries. We also have the PTA events that are happening in Autumn and many more. We have been developing the structure of our leadership team putting more emphasis on phase leaders and the leadership structure giving you more contact people to help with any queries you may have.

We are working with more outside agencies this year to develop our after school provision and clubs. Thank you for your patience on this – Autumn is always a very long term and trying to get the ball rolling takes time without causing clashes of hall and playground spaces. We are looking to introduce STEM club and chess club and I have had meetings this week to arrange this. Please look out for the details in the next coming weeks. STEM club is aiming to start in Spring.

We have been interviewing the Year 6's this week for their roles as House Captains and Vice Captains and they have been preparing and presenting their slides. Staff members have also been voting for their head boy and head girl too. I am very proud of all the children who have taken part – they all have stepped up heading from Year 5 understanding their role in the school and the importance of preparing for Year 6.

I have been in and around the classes each and every day which has been nice. I have made my way over to EYFS (Reception and Nursery) to see our newest family members. It is great to see many children settling in so quickly. It is a huge step for children who are younger to join a school.

We have been given a donation of around £2000 from the kind donations from Mrs Philbey's collection. We also aim to plant a tree in honour of the great Mrs Philbey.


