Workshops, Bikes and Achievements!

Dear all,

Thank you everyone for attending the various workshops that we have had over the past two weeks. It is great to see parents and families and answering any questions. Please always feel free to come and speak to us if you have any questions, we are more than happy to support.

We have been busy this week with Bikeability as well as sporting events over the past two weeks. We have some county runners who will be representing our area in a few weeks as well as some great achievements in football and basketball, see below for more details.

We have continued to work on our Maths curriculum this year, developing fluency sessions for all classes to practice their recall skills. It is essential for TTrockstars and Numbots to be done regularly for homework to really help with developing this target for the year. Mrs Levy and I have been working on Maths to ensure that every child leaving our school is confident in Maths.

I have had the luxury of working in Reception and Nursery over the last two weeks getting to know our children and how they are learning. They are very polite and always say hello! We have completed the Reception Baseline Assessment's and many of the children showed me how they count and begin to sound out words.

I have also been lucky to teach in Forest school on Friday's, teaching the children how to use bow saws and loppers. Children have been following the safety rules and tools talks perfectly to ensure all children are safe. Some classes even made shelters and learnt how to tie a clover hitch! I was very impressed!

We have introduced Drama classes on Fridays with Year 4 and 5 and our Drama teacher Sam has already had a great impact. I am excited to see this grow. We are also exploring OPAL at lunch times and it is great to see so many children bringing wellies and old shoes in order to use the field more. The forest is buzzing with children at lunch times – it has been a great start to our OPAL journey.

Finally, we are looking at the diary heading into Christmas (not long to go) and the events that come up during this busy period. Please keep an eye on the diary dates for all of the enjoyable activities that we will be taking part in.

Nursery:




trees, before hanging tarpaulin over the top! We were very happy with the results.
