Welcome message from the Headteacher

Thank you for all your support!

Dear all,

I hope you have all had a good two weeks, the weather has been a range of cold, wet and stormy but our children continue to be resilient in coming in and learning each day.

We have had a busy two weeks with several projects beginning. Our front of the school courtyard has been planned and stages have begun. Our new fence line between the carpark and the courtyard is being worked on to create our new entrance area. I have met with the building team who aim to get all work done by February half term as well as a new gate system and school system finalised in the half term ready for Spring 2. I will continue to update you during this time, thank you everyone for your patience regarding the carpark and entering the school. During this time, we ask that when the courtyard is out of bounds, for all scooters and bikes to be lined up outside the office on the main playground. This is only temporary until the courtyard is finished.

We have been very busy with our staffing team as we have a few upcoming changes during the Summer term. Please see below regarding our changes. Letters have been sent out directly to the classes with staffing changes.

OPAL continues to go well, and we are slowly getting donations in for toys, pallets and kitchen utensils. Any equipment that can be donated would be greatly appreciated. We have received new playtime equipment from the AGMS foundation, this has brought new footballs, basketballs, tennis balls, egg and spoons and other lunch time equipment.

The Parish have also donated some money towards our OPAL project which will support getting our sand pit sorted once it has been dug out. Thank you to the parish for this kind donation as well as the children who are digging the sand pit out. It will take a while, but it will be worth it in the end. I also want to say thank you to all parents for allowing your children to explore outdoor learning and whilst they are muddy, having fun at lunch times. We are going to invest in some mud suits for children who particularly like to get rather muddy but they will be used by all.

Forest School

This term, we will be focusing on a range of outdoor skills, including fire safety and management, knotting techniques, and building simple shelters. These activities are designed to help children grow in confidence, resilience and independence as they learn to work with natural materials and collaborate with their peers.

Please ensure that children come to school dressed appropriately on Forest School days. They will be spending extended periods outdoors and are likely to get muddy, wet or cold. Warm layers, waterproof clothing and sturdy footwear make a big difference to their comfort and enjoyment.



Our Forest School curriculum is something we are continually developing. As our grounds have now reached a stage where we can expand and enrich the learning opportunities, we are excited to introduce more structured progression in skills and knowledge. Over time, children will revisit key skills at increasing levels of challenge, helping them build mastery and confidence.

Our continuous provision has also had a makeover this fortnight, with dressing-up added to inspire language-rich play and it's been a huge hit. All in all, a fabulous couple of weeks... and

Year 2:



Year 2 have been really enjoying their cricket lessons each Monday. They are always keen to participate. We have also had a handball session led by Monks Walk where the children were engaged in lots of different games, building on their throwing skills. In Dance, children have been listening to different pieces of music, finding the beat and creating 4 step sequences with a theme for the songs. So far, our themes have been animals and space.

Year 3:



In Year 3 we have been enjoying sports lessons with Mr O' Neill from Monks Walk School. Here we are learning to play handball. We had lots of fun together developing our ball skills.

Year 4:



Year 4 have been hard at work throughout January. We have continued our learning around Earthquakes and Volcanoes in Geography - two things that have really captured the attention of the children! On Friday 23rd we took part in forest school, where we had a go at building dens and lighting small fires using flint & steel. We have many successful Firestarter's!

Year 5:



Year 5 have been thoroughly enjoying their Dance unit in PE – they have learnt to hand-jive and 'Rock around the Clock' In fact we struggled to get a photo that wasn't blurry as they were moving so fast!!!



Year 6: Year 6 have had a super fun few weeks. We have been busy writing our adventure stories which we are publishing next week! In the last few days, we have also had lots of excitement for a song we have looked at in music: 'You to me are Everything' by the Real Thing. I am sure lots of parents will know it! We even learned some 70s disco dance moves!

Here is some useful information that is happening in the Parish.

The Churchwardens would like to thank everyone who contributed to the 2025 Christmas Appeal.

The idea was that all monies contributed via our school services would go towards our two chosen charities - *Isabel Hospice* and the *Sisters of the Beatitudes*. The rest of the funds from parishioners would then help us "over the line" as a parish financially into 2026 as we look to continue to engage in mission.

The final total raised was **£4781.48** before reclaimable Gift Aid. Of this **£150** was given at our schools services.

The Standing Committee of the Parochial Church Council therefore agreed on Monday that in view of the large amount raised


