## Welcome message from the Headteacher

### Rain, sun and a little bit of fun!

Dear all,  
What peculiar weather we have had over the past two weeks? We have had the scorching sun over the half term and returned to rain, flooding, and thunderstorms. Thank you all for being patient with the flooding situation at the back gate, this has been escalated with Thames Water and whilst they have cleared the issue, I have requested a further investigation for a long-term solution.

The school has been busy implementing our new iPad management system, **Jamf**. This platform enables us to meet the updated safeguarding requirements for monitoring and filtering that will come into effect in September 2026. We are also delighted to be becoming a flagship school for the programme, with colleagues from other schools visiting to see how effectively the system has been implemented and how it is supporting teaching, learning, and safeguarding across the school.

The children have been very busy this half term starting off with several assessments. Year 4 have completed their MTC test this week and Year 1 and 2 have been working on their phonics. Year 6 are being externally moderated for writing and continue to push to show some incredible pieces of writing. Reception is working on finalising their Early Learning Goals too. Reports are being written as we speak for our end of year outcomes; staff are using the INSET day tomorrow to complete these. I then have around 2 weeks to read and comment ready for July. I have already read one classes reports and feel overjoyed to read such incredible comments from the staff about our pupils. I am very proud of them all.

Sports week has been planned for and we continue to work on developing this further. Unfortunately, sports premium money is stopping at the end of this year with only a term of transition to a new system. I will keep you updated on what will happen with this. We will always continue to offer sporting competitions and will wait for the DFE and Sports England to update us on their future systems. Working with 7 other primary schools and Monk's Walk, we will continue to provide competitions for our children even if it is slightly different.

We are also working on the calendar for next year and will update this shortly on the website and calendar. I will again reach out to the website provider to see if they can migrate the calendar for home use. Watch this space.

- Our new JamF iPad system is up and running and working well across the school.
- We have 4 new staff laptops that have been given out to allow more effective teaching and communication.
- We have had lots of items donated for OPAL from parents and families, thank you so much!
- We have created a team of governors, staff the chair of the Friends and myself to create a plan regarding the field
- We have ordered some items for our river side to be spent on from the donation from Thamas Water- thank you for this £2500 donation.
- New boilers have been put in every single classroom and updated water systems.

### Sports Day Friday - 3<sup>rd</sup> July 2026:

Sports day is going to be a busy day with lots planned – I am looking forward to it. Children will be asked to wear house group colours. Children will sit in their house groups (apart from Nursery). They will be cheering their house groups together for extra house points! Races will begin around 9:15am with the aim to be finished around 11:30am. Each child will take part in each race if they wish. Events include: egg and spoon, obstacle course, sack race, running and relays. At the end of the event, children will be asked to go back to class at around 11:30am to prepare for our picnic lunch. # Academic Highlights

Here is some useful information that is happening in the school.

## Nursery:



Last week, the children enjoyed learning about the story *The Very Hungry Caterpillar*. They sequenced pictures from the story and were excited to act out the life cycle of a butterfly. In Maths, the children practised matching numerals to corresponding quantities and ordering numbers.

This week, the children are continuing their learning about minibeasts and have listened to the story of *Incy Wincy Spider*. They enjoyed singing the nursery rhyme and following the story, making predictions about which animal would appear next.

## Reception:



Reception are learning about living and non-living things at the moment. We have been thinking about what the characteristics are of living things, such as the ability to breathe, grow and move. We specifically looked at different animals.

We then thought about our favourite animals and painted them, creating our own Reception zoo!

## Year 1:



Year 1 have had a fantastic start to our final half term. We thoroughly enjoyed a visit from Safari Stu as part of our Science learning about animals. The children had an amazing opportunity to meet and handle a range of fascinating animals, including

snakes, skinny pigs and other exotic creatures. It was a wonderful hands-on experience which helped bring our learning about animal groups and classification to life.

## Year 2:



Year 2 had a fun packed week last week. Although it was wet, windy and chilly on our class trip to the beach, we still managed to have fun! We played in the sand and made sure to get our ice-creams before we left! We also really enjoyed our afternoon when

Safari Stu came to visit. We got to encounter and even hold a range of animals from a hissing cockroach, to turtles, snakes and a chameleon!

## Year 3:



In Year 3 we were taking part in drama as part of our RE lesson. We were learning all about Jesus calling his 12 disciples. We had lots of fun re-enacting the story.

## Year 4:



We're into the final half-term of the academic year and Year 4 are continuing to work hard. This week we've completed our Multiplication Tables Check and every pupil should be proud of how hard they've worked practicing and revising their Times Tables over the last few months!

We've also started some new units of learning and been treated to special football session with a coach from Tottenham Hotspur!

## Year 5:

Year 5 have been watching these butterflies grow this term. They started out as caterpillars, we observed their metamorphosis, they turned into beautiful butterflies and just before half term we released them!
